## APPLY EARLY TO AVOID THE LAST MINUTE RUSH

### LIMITED ENTRY HUNTING

Limited Entry Hunting (LEH) is a service by which hunting authorizations are awarded to resident hunters based on a lottery or random draw. The purpose of LEH is to achieve wildlife management objectives and maintain hunting opportunity.

LEH seasons are introduced where it has become necessary to limit the number of hunters or limit the number, class or sex of animals that may be harvested. The following species of game are available under LEH within certain areas of the province: bison, black bear, caribou, elk, moose,

mountain goat, mountain sheep, deer, and turkey. Many of these species are also available through a General Open Season (GOS).

Although GOS may precede or coincide with LEH seasons for the same species in the same area, the class of animal available during the GOS will be different from the class of animal available during the LEH seasons.

It is an offence under the [Wildlife Act](#) to allow another person to use your licence or limited entry hunting authorization or to use another person's licence or limited entry hunting authorization.

### Where can I get a licence or apply for LEH?

**Fees:** The fee for an LEH application is \$6.30, including taxes, and is not refundable.

**Buy online** at [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting)

- You will need a credit card for payment.
- You will also need a basic BCeID to use the WILD online service. A BCeID is an account that provides secure electronic access to online government services, including the WILD online service. If you do not have a basic BCeID, you will be prompted to register for one when you sign on at [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting). You do not need a BCeID if you buy your hunting licence or LEH application in person.

**Buy in person** at any [participating vendor location](#) or at a [Service BC](#) or [FrontCounter BC](#) office. We suggest you call ahead to see if they are open and carry the product you wish to purchase.

- You will need acceptable photo ID and form of payment (some vendors do not accept cheques). Make sure you ask for the official Ministry receipt which includes the details of your purchase.
- If you are applying for LEH, you will need to bring the hunt code(s) you wish to apply for.

### Who Can Apply?

Any resident of British Columbia who holds a Fish and Wildlife ID with active B.C. resident and hunting credentials may apply. To be eligible to obtain a B.C. resident credential, hunters must be a B.C. resident as defined in the [Wildlife Act](#) or qualify for an exemption. To obtain the hunting credential, a hunter must prove successful completion of hunter safety training such as Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education (CORE).

**The province requires hunters to prove B.C. residency every three years.** This will ensure only eligible hunters access hunting licences, permits and authorizations available to residents only. To renew your B.C. resident credential, access the WILD online service at [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting). Please contact FrontCounter BC at 1-877-855-3222 if you need help with updating your B.C. resident credential. If your B.C. resident credential has expired, you will be ineligible to submit an LEH application until you renew your resident credential. Please note if your resident credential expires while your LEH application is Awaiting Draw it will not affect your results in the draw. However, if you are no longer a resident of B.C., you are not eligible to hunt under an LEH authorization.

To enter the LEH draw, First Nations persons residing in B.C. require a Fish and Wildlife ID with an active B.C. resident credential and either a hunting credential or a Licence Exemption WA S.11(9) credential (Licence Exemption credential). Persons residing in B.C. who are eligible to be registered under the [Indian Act](#) (Canada) will be granted the Licence Exemption credential and resident credentials upon proving eligibility for status and residency.

A hunter may not apply for or be issued an LEH authorization if the hunter is suspended, has a revoked or cancelled hunting licence or credential, has overdue reports or royalties, or if the hunter has unpaid fines under the [Wildlife Act](#) or [Firearms Act](#). Applications submitted by a person who becomes ineligible to win an authorization will not be entered in the draw and no refund will be issued.

### Your Fish and Wildlife ID (FWID)

You need a Fish and Wildlife ID (FWID) to buy hunting licences or submit LEH applications. Your FWID is a permanent number linked to your personal Fish and Wildlife online profile. Your profile contains details about your credentials, licences, LEH applications and authorizations.

### An individual may only have one FWID.

If you previously had a B.C. Resident hunter number, a FWID profile was created for you. Your new FWID will be your hunter number with three extra digits at the beginning. You can obtain your FWID online by logging into WILD with your hunter number ([www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting)).

There is no cost to get your FWID.

**NOTIFICATION**

**LEH authorizations are electronic and are NOT mailed to successful applicants.**

You can check your FWID profile online at [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting) any time after the draw has been run to find out if you have been successful. You can also find out if you were successful by visiting a Service BC, FrontCounter BC or any participating vendor location.

You are not required to carry a paper copy of your LEH authorization while hunting. If the species you harvest is subject to compulsory inspection, you are required to provide the limited entry hunting successful application number to the inspector. See Shared Hunt Rules for important details on the Harvest Report section of your LEH authorization. Check the current Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis before you hunt.

**LEH IMPORTANT MESSAGES**

If your LEH application is successful, **you must check** for important messages associated with your authorization before you hunt. Important messages are posted on the LEH page of the [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting) website.

**TWO LICENCES REQUIRED**

If you obtain an LEH authorization, you must also have a resident hunting licence and the appropriate species licence to lawfully hunt.

**HOW TO USE THIS SYNOPSIS**

Hunting opportunities advertised in this synopsis are arranged by species, then by region, followed by class of animal, and finally by the Management Unit (M.U.) where the hunt takes place. Management Units may also be divided or combined into areas (LEH hunt areas) which are legally permissible to hunt during an LEH hunt season. The "MAP SECTION" of this synopsis displays these boundaries. Where an LEH hunt area occurs over an entire M.U., a map of that M.U. is not provided in this synopsis. For maps of M.U. or zone boundaries, go to [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting) or make your own using iMapBC at [www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/data/geographic-data-services/web-based-mapping/iMapbc](http://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/data/geographic-data-services/web-based-mapping/iMapbc).

Each hunt is given its own unique 4-digit code, which is highlighted on the left of each column on each page. DO NOT use last year's LEH synopsis, as the codes may have changed.

Be sure to read all the sections within this synopsis, to understand the Limited Entry Hunting program.

**FIRST NATIONS APPLICANTS**

The Ministry recognizes that First Nations may establish aboriginal rights to harvest wildlife for sustenance (food, social, and ceremonial purposes) within their traditional areas, and that treaty First Nations have treaty rights in relation to harvesting wildlife. Those uses of wildlife must be sustainable and harvesting methods must not jeopardize public safety or the use and enjoyment of property. Any hunting of wildlife species for

sale or barter, in whole or in part, is not legal, except as authorized by regulation or where there is a demonstrated aboriginal or treaty right to do so.

Persons who are eligible to be registered under the [Indian Act](#) (Canada) residing in B.C. are not required to obtain a hunting licence or a species licence under the [Wildlife Act](#).

Individuals who exercise an aboriginal right to hunt for sustenance purposes within a traditionally used area or who exercise treaty rights are required to comply with hunting regulations related to public health and public safety. In situations where conservation of a particular species is of concern and compliance with hunting regulations is required by individuals exercising aboriginal or treaty rights, which may include the requirement for Limited Entry Hunting authorizations, there will be prior consultation with the affected First Nations in accordance with Ministry policy and procedures. Enquiries about a traditional hunting area, practice or requirements that may apply should be forwarded to the appropriate First Nation officials or Regional Fish and Wildlife Office.

First Nations individuals who wish to hunt outside their traditionally used territory or treaty areas must do so in accordance with hunting regulations (except for the licensing exemption previously described for persons residing in B.C. who are eligible to be registered under the [Indian Act](#), Canada). This includes making application for an LEH authorization via the LEH draw. A Fish and Wildlife ID with an active B.C. resident credential and either a hunting credential or a [Licence Exemption WA S.11\(9\)](#) credential is required to submit an application for LEH. For the purpose of entering the LEH draw, persons residing in B.C. who are eligible to be registered under the [Indian Act](#) (Canada) will be granted the [Licence Exemption WA S.11\(9\)](#) and resident credentials upon proving eligibility for status and residency. Proof of status includes an Indian status card (expired status cards are acceptable), a Temporary Confirmation of Registration Document (TCRD) or a letter confirming status or the eligibility for status from the hunter's Band Office or First Nations Government.

**ONE APPLICATION PER SPECIES**

An applicant may only enter one application per LEH species per draw.

The term 'species' as used in this synopsis refers to the type of game animal, such as moose, elk, caribou, etc., and encompasses all classes, such as bulls, cows, calves, etc., of that species. For example, bull moose and an antlerless moose are considered the same species.

A person may not apply for a second mountain sheep for hunts that occur in the same licence year, if they were successful in receiving an LEH authorization in an earlier draw.

**SECOND CHOICES**

An LEH application presents an option for you to make a second hunt choice for the SAME SPECIES. Entering a second choice is optional. **WHAT ARE YOUR CHANCES?**

The LEH draw is a lottery, and there are no guarantees of success. For the main draw in 2023, 159,211 applications were entered and 21,243 authorizations were issued for 9 species. Therefore, on average, one in every 7 applications was successful. Odds for each hunt vary and depends on the number of applicants and the number of available authorizations.

**ENHANCED ODDS**

For hunters who have not won an LEH authorization recently, enhanced odds increase their chances by reducing the chances of those who have been successful in recent years. If you were successful in receiving an LEH authorization for any species, except deer, black bear, and turkey your odds will be reduced for that species. If you were successful for elk in Regions 1 or 2 or moose anywhere in the province, your odds are reduced by 66% for 3 years for that species. If you were successful for any other species, except deer, black bear, and turkey your odds are reduced by 50% for one year for that species.

**INDIVIDUAL HUNTS**

All hunts are open to individual applicants. Some hunts also allow for group or shared applications. Please see sections below for details about group and shared hunts.

**GROUP HUNTS**

Group Hunts are available to hunters who wish to apply as a group. Group Hunt applications cannot be submitted for elk in Regions 1 and 2, moose, bison, or black bear anywhere in the province. Applicants can apply as a group of two, three or four persons.

Group Hunt applications are entered in the draw as one entry for the whole group. If a Group Hunt application is drawn and there are enough remaining authorizations for each group member, each hunter in the group receives an LEH authorization and each hunter may harvest an authorized animal. If any member of a group was drawn for the same species the previous year, the entire group is subject to reduced odds.

When applying for a Group Hunt, please be aware that the number of authorizations printed in the synopsis is tentative. In the event that there are not sufficient authorizations available to provide everyone in the group with an authorization, the group will not be drawn.

**SHARED HUNTS**

Like Group Hunts, Shared Hunts are available to persons who wish to apply as a group. However, Shared Hunts are only available for moose or bison. The Shared Hunt is intended

to increase the number of people drawn for moose or bison without increasing the number of moose or bison harvested in a given year. Applicants can apply as a group of two, three or four persons.

For a Shared Hunt application, each member of the group is entered in the draw as a separate application. If any member of the group is drawn, the entire group is treated as being drawn and authorizations are issued as follows: A group of two will be authorized to take one moose or bison, and a group of three or four will be authorized to take two moose or bison. However, **if only one authorization remains in the draw, and a Shared Hunt group of three or four persons is drawn, the group will be authorized to take one moose or bison only.** All members of a drawn Shared Hunt application will have reduced odds the following year(s). For the current application year, if any member of a Shared Hunt application for a moose was drawn in the previous three years, or any member of a Shared Hunt application for a bison was drawn in the previous year, the entire group will be subject to reduced odds.

#### SHARED HUNT RULES

Any member of a Shared Hunt may harvest an authorized animal. For shared hunts only, each hunter of the shared group is required to carry the Harvest Report form while hunting. The Harvest Report form is on the bottom part of the shared limited entry hunting authorization. Your shared limited entry hunting authorization is available online in your Fish and Wildlife profile. Communication is required within the group while hunting to avoid exceeding the group limit. Once an authorized animal is harvested, the successful hunter must immediately inform the other members of the group, and each member of the group must immediately document the successful harvest on their Harvest Report form.

#### HOW TO APPLY FOR A GROUP OR SHARED HUNT

Applications for group and shared hunts can be submitted online at [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting) or at any FrontCounter BC, Service BC or participating vendor location. **At time of application**, the group **initiator** may also submit and pay for up to three group members. To add members to your group, you will need to have their FWID number, last name and first initial. Due to privacy policies, agents will not look up your group members' details.

Alternatively, after the group initiator submits their application, they can give the Group ID to three other hunters. All hunters who wish to join an existing group must have the Group ID at the time of application. Your Group ID number can be located on your Ministry generated receipt or online in your Fish and Wildlife Profile.

**We suggest that you verify that all group members you are wanting to add currently have an active BC Resident**

**credential so that they can be added to your group.**

#### DEADLINES FOR APPLICATIONS

##### MAIN DRAW

Applications for the main draw (fall hunts) must be submitted by **11:59 p.m. THURSDAY JUNE 13, 2024.**

##### EARLY SKEENA MOUNTAIN SHEEP AND HAIDA GWAII BLACK BEAR DRAW

Applications for the spring draw (Skeena sheep and Haida Gwaii black bear) must be submitted by **11:59 p.m. Thursday, February 6, 2025.**

#### HUNTING AND SPECIES LICENCES

You must have a basic hunting licence to hunt in B.C. There are three types of basic hunting licences available to B.C. Residents: Resident Hunting Licence, Youth Hunting Licence, and Initiation Hunting Licence. Your hunting licence is electronic and will be visible on your Fish and Wildlife profile. You do not need access to your profile while hunting. Conservation Officers can view your Fish and Wildlife profile on their mobile devices to check your credentials, licences and LEH authorizations. **Please note, while hunting, you are required to carry your photo ID and know or produce your FWID number to an officer.**

You may also require species licences, see the current Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis for information. **You must carry all of your cancelled or uncanceled species licences purchased for the current licence year with you while hunting.** You must cancel your licence by notching it as soon as you harvest an animal. If you buy a species licence online, it will be mailed to you (please ensure your mailing address is accurate and up to date), **allow up to 3 weeks for arrival.** You can also buy your licence over the counter at any participating vendor location.

#### BAG LIMIT

An LEH authorization does not permit a person to exceed the hunting season bag limit for any species. See the current [Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis](#) for information on provincial and regional bag limits.

#### YOUTH AND INITIATION HUNTERS

The holder of a Youth Hunting Licence can hunt under the authority of their supervising hunter's LEH. If the Youth Hunting Licence holder harvests an LEH species, it is the animal authorized by the supervising hunter's LEH and the supervising hunter must cancel the appropriate species licence and count that animal against their bag limit.

The holder of an Initiation Hunting Licence cannot hunt under the authority of their supervising hunter's LEH.

#### COMPULSORY INSPECTION

Please refer to the [2024-2026 Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis](#) for information and regulations regarding compulsory inspection (CI).

Hunters must provide the species licence and limited entry hunting authorization, which authorized the taking or the killing, in electronic or paper format, to the inspector.

Anyone who kills a bull elk, bull moose **or bull caribou** under the authority of an LEH authorization must, while returning from the hunt, keep the antlers of the animal available for inspection by an officer. This is in addition to any other compulsory inspection/reporting requirements.

#### THIS SYNOPSIS IS NOT A COMPLETE LIST OF REQUIREMENTS FOR HUNTING IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

All persons hunting under an LEH authorization in B.C. are required to comply with hunting regulations under the [Wildlife Act](#) as outlined in the current [Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis](#).

#### RESPONSIBLE USE OF VEHICLES

The modern [Off-Road Vehicle Act](#) (ORV Act) promotes safe and responsible use of ORVs. Improved safety and mandatory registration help officers better identify the few reckless operators that endanger others, harm animals or damage sensitive habitat. The fine for careless operation or damage to property is \$368 and for unregistered ORVs, \$230. The ORV Act applies to All-terrain vehicles, off-road motorcycles, snowmobiles, side-by-sides, and on-highway vehicles (under 4,536 kg) used for work or play on Crown land.

Protect wildlife and their habitat; keep motor vehicles on existing roads and trails.

#### WILDFIRE NOTICE

LIMITED ENTRY HUNTING - TERMINOLOGY

(An explanation of the column titles used in the season tables)

**CODE:** Each hunt is given its own unique 4-digit code, which is highlighted on the left of each column on each page. Codes change every year.

**AREA:** This term is used in conjunction with a place name to denote a specific land area within B.C. It can consist of a number of Management Units, a single Management Unit, or a portion of a Management Unit. Hunters should be aware access is limited in some areas and are advised to confirm access before applying.

**MANAGEMENT UNITS:** The province is divided into 225 management units identified by number. In this synopsis they are denoted by the initials 'M.U.' and a hyphenated number, i.e. M.U. 4-24, M.U. 3-14, etc.

**ZONE:** Means a portion of one or more management units. If the Management Unit has been divided into Zones, this will appear as Zone A of M.U. 4-24, Zone B of M.U. 4-24, etc. Maps of Zones may be found on pages 16-34 or online at [www.gov.bc.ca/hunting](http://www.gov.bc.ca/hunting).


**SEASON DATES:** Refer to a period of time that hunting may take place. All dates are inclusive, e.g., September 1 to September 30 means that hunting may commence on September 1 and continue through to and including September 30.

**SPECIES:** In this synopsis, 'species' refers to the following game: Bison, Black Bear, Caribou, Elk, Moose, Mountain Goat, Mountain Sheep, Mule (Black-tailed) Deer, and Turkey.

**CLASS OF ANIMAL:** This term refers more specifically to the sex, age, or antler/horn configuration of the animal for which an authorization is available. Refer to [2024-2026 Hunting & Trapping Regulations Synopsis](#) for definitions.

**TENTATIVE # OF AUTH:** The number which appears in the authorizations column is a tentative number only and may be adjusted prior to the draw, resulting in a possible increase or decrease in the final number of available authorizations.

**FIRST CHOICE ODDS:** This is a list of odds on being drawn for the same hunt in the previous LEH draw year. These odds pertain to hunts that were indicated as 'First Choice' selections on the previous year's applications. They are a measure of the number of people who applied for each authorization available in the previous year. The odds can be used as a guide to estimate your chances of winning a given draw.



Hunters should be aware access is limited in some areas and are advised to confirm access before applying.

# SPECIAL MOUNTAIN SHEEP RESIDENT DRAW FOR 2025 HUNT

The Special Mountain Sheep resident draw is available to resident hunters for 2025/26 licence year, and the code is 6000. Hunters have the option to submit multiple applications for this draw.

There is only one resident Special Mountain Sheep authorization for one Mountain Sheep.

The successful applicant for the Special Mountain Sheep hunt must hold a valid resident hunting licence, a Mountain Sheep species licence and the Special Mountain Sheep authorization while hunting. Please note that, while the Special Mountain Sheep authorization allows the hunter to exceed the provincial bag limit of 1 and harvest an additional Sheep in the same licence year, the hunter CANNOT hold more than one valid Mountain Sheep species licence at any one time. A second species licence may not be purchased until after the first species licence has been cancelled. If a hunter receives a Special Mountain Sheep authorization, it will not be considered in the calculation of reduced odds for future LEH

applications. All other restrictions, including the location of open seasons, weapons restrictions, species, and sex listed in either the 2025-2026 LEH Synopsis or the 2024-2026 Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis, when available, apply to this special hunt. The successful applicant need not follow horn curl regulations that apply in the area hunted as the Special Mountain Sheep authorization will be for "any ram."

In addition, the successful applicant will have the opportunity to hunt either a bighorn or thornhorn ram Mountain Sheep during the dates listed below. If hunting a thornhorn ram sheep, the successful applicant may hunt up to 21 days prior to the opening date listed below for the intended hunt region.

The non-refundable application fee for each Special Mountain Sheep application is \$15.75 (includes GST). \$10.00 from each application fee will be directed to the Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation for projects specific to Mountain Sheep Management.

## 2025 OPENING SEASON DATES FOR MOUNTAIN SHEEP (Subject to Change)

Limited motorized access with snow machines is likely to be necessary for November and December but snow depths may vary greatly from year to year.

Hunters are prohibited from using a weapon other than:

- a rifle that fires a 175 grain or larger bullet retaining 2712 joules (2000 foot pounds) or more energy at 100 metres, or
- a bow having a pull greater than 22.6 kg within the archer's draw length, an arrow greater than 26 grams in weight and a broadhead greater than 8.1 grams in weight and 2.2 cm in width at its widest point.

Hunters are reminded that under Section 35(2) of the [Wildlife Act](#), anyone who kills or injures wildlife must make every reasonable effort to retrieve that wildlife, and if it is alive, to kill it. This is particularly important with Bison.

## BLACK BEAR

The LEH draw for black bear on Haida Gwaii will be conducted during the spring draw, at the same time as Skeena Sheep. Hunters that obtain an LEH authorization for black bear on Haida Gwaii may hunt in both the spring and fall season.

## CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) is a fatal brain disease found in species of the deer family (cervids). Infected animals may not appear sick as signs take months to develop after infection. In advanced stages of the disease, weight loss, behaviour changes, drooling, poor coordination, and trembling may be seen. **If you observe a cervid with these symptoms please report them and their location to the Conservation Officer Service through the RAPP Line (1-877-952-7277) or to the B.C. Wildlife Health Program at CWD@gov.bc.ca**

CWD was confirmed for the first time in B.C. in January 2024. CWD The B.C. CWD Program has implemented a response plan that is focused on limiting disease transmission and spread to new areas.

Hunters can help by understanding the risks of CWD. Please follow regulations to reduce the risk of CWD spread by human activity. Materials that contain CWD prions, such as carcasses and urine-based scents, can introduce CWD to new areas, contaminate the environment and expose wildlife. If transporting cervid parts from areas affected by CWD be aware of the risks and dispose of this material in a landfill. Ensure tools and equipment are properly cleaned (40% bleach solution has been effective on metal surfaces).

Hunters and trappers can also help by submitting samples. CWD testing provides critical information needed to support science-based disease management. If you hunt deer, elk, or moose, please submit samples for testing. **Submission of samples from harvested deer is mandatory in high risk areas of B.C.** Learn about how and where to submit samples at: [www.gov.bc.ca/chronicwastingdisease](http://www.gov.bc.ca/chronicwastingdisease).

## HANDLING GAME MEAT SAFELY

These general safety measures are recommended when handling game meat:

- Do not shoot, handle or consume any animal that is acting abnormally or appears to be sick.
- Wear latex or rubber gloves when field dressing or handling any dead animal.
- Bone out the meat from your animal. Don't saw through bone if you can avoid it, and avoid cutting through the brain or spinal cord.
- Minimize the handling of brain and spinal tissues.
- Wash hands and instruments thoroughly after field dressing is completed.

2. **Record:** suspect/vehicle information, type of violation, location, date and time.
3. **Report** as soon as possible.

The BC Wildlife Federation pays rewards up to \$2,000 for information leading to the conviction of persons who have violated laws related to the protection of fish, wildlife, or the environment, or damaged the property of companies or individuals who provide access to hunters and anglers.

## KNOW THE DIFFERENCE

between **White-tailed Deer**  
and **Mule (Black-tailed) Deer**

It is important for hunters to be able to distinguish between White-tailed Deer and Mule Deer. Hunters should not rely on one feature, but use a combination of characteristics to identify their target before shooting. The following diagrams and descriptions are intended to aid hunters in field identification of these species.

It is important to remember opportunities for antlerless Mule Deer are generally limited, and only available by LEH in most areas.

### Mule Deer

- Large ears in proportion to head
- Large white rump patch, rope-like white tail with a black tip
- Body generally greyish in color
- Does not raise its tail when alarmed
- Bounds in stiff-legged gait on all fours when running
- Mature males with light face and nose
- Antlers (of older males) fork and fork again



### White-tailed Deer

- Ears are smaller in proportion to the head compared to mule deer
- Brown rump, flattened tail brown in color with a white fringe. Underside of tail is white. Body generally brownish in color
- Raises and flags its tail when alarmed
- Runs when escaping, as opposed to the bounding escape of mule deer
- Darker face with white rings around the eyes and nose
- Antlers (of older males) consist of main beams with multiple points projecting upward





MAP 1A) NORTH/CENTRAL VANCOUVER ISLAND - ELK AND MULE (BLACK-TAILED) DEER



**HUNTING ETHICS**

It is extremely important for hunters to realize that they use a public resource! With this privilege it is vital to maintain a perception among the public that we hunt in an ethical and humane manner. The majority of British Columbians support hunting to one degree or another, but there is a prevalent misunderstanding among the general public as to the role that hunters play in conservation and environmental stewardship. Fueling that misunderstanding are images and media reports of hunters who are at least perceived to be acting in a less than upstanding manner, or who disrespect the wildlife they pursue.

It is important for all of us to remember not only the legal obligations, but also the unwritten rules of ethics that keep hunting a great sport.

- Safety for yourself, your companions, and the public is the most important aspect of hunter training. Hunting accidents continue to be very rare because we all know that there is no room for recklessness at the expense of safety and courtesy.
- Have respect for the sensitivities of others. Do not display your kill or firearms where it may offend other people. What may impress your friends may not have the same effect on your neighbours.
- Respect wildlife and the sanctity of the harvested animals' lives. Strive to make every kill a clean one. Prepare your firearm in advance of, and during, the season to ensure accuracy and dependability. Practice your marksmanship at a licensed firing range, and do not shoot unless you have a clear shot of a vital part of the animal. Remember: "you can't pull the bullet back."
- Prepare the meat properly. Proper handling of meat is easy to learn and to not do so is both illegal and wasteful.

- Respect the environment by packing out everything you packed in! Nobody wants to arrive at a campsite and clean up the mess left by the previous occupants.
- Do not consume drugs or alcohol while hunting.
- Respect private property. Always seek permission from landowners and thank them for the opportunities given. Unless explicitly stated, permission granted once does not entitle you to access the property on subsequent occasions.
- Please respect gates, fences, and equipment as they are there for a reason. Leave everything the way you found it.
- Be the eyes and ears for the enforcement agencies and report those who break the law. Remember the RAPP program 1-877-952-7277 (RAPP) or [rapp.bc.ca](http://rapp.bc.ca).
- Be aware that you are a mentor when youth are observing.
- Respect your fellow hunters. Work with one another to promote good relationships, safety, knowledge and a fair distribution of opportunity and harvest.
- Lead by example, you are an ambassador for the public and media image of hunting.
- Ethical hunters are critical to effective and sustainable wildlife management, and to the ethical hunter we offer our sincerest gratitude; opportunities for the sustainable use of wildlife are possible because of you.

## INDIGENOUS HUNTERS IN B.C.

The Ministry of Water, Land, and Resource Stewardship (the "Ministry") first priority for wildlife management is to ensure the long-term conservation of wildlife populations and their habitats. The Ministry recognizes that First Nations play an important role in wildlife stewardship and may have or establish Aboriginal or treaty rights protected by section 35(1) of the [Constitution Act](#), 1982, including rights to harvest wildlife for food, social and ceremonial purposes in their traditional territories.

Harvesting wildlife under Aboriginal and treaty rights must be sustainable and harvesting methods must not jeopardize public safety or the use and enjoyment of property. The Ministry also recognizes that First Nations may have traditional governance structures, protocols, laws, and customs that manage their members. The Ministry continues to work collaboratively with First Nations and stakeholders to manage hunting for the effective stewardship of wildlife within the province.

Persons registered under the [Indian Act](#) (Canada) residing in British Columbia are not required to have a hunting licence or species licences. However, First Nation individuals are required to have a federal Firearms Licence and comply with hunting regulations related to public health, public safety, and conservation. Any hunting of wildlife species for sale or barter, in whole or in part, is not legal, except as authorized by regulation or where there is a demonstrated Aboriginal or treaty right to do so.

In situations where conservation of a particular wildlife population is of concern and compliance with hunting regulations is required by individuals exercising Aboriginal or treaty rights – which may include the requirement for Limited Entry Hunting (LEH) authorizations – there will be prior consultation with the affected First Nations in accordance with Ministry policy and procedures.

If a First Nation member is in doubt regarding a traditional hunting area or practice, or regulations that may apply, they should contact the appropriate First Nation's officials and the Ministry regional office to discuss specific situations.

First Nation members who wish to hunt outside their traditionally used territory or treaty areas must comply with the Hunting Regulations which can be found in both the LEH and Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopses (except for the licencing exemption described above). This includes making application for an LEH authorization via the LEH draw. A Fish and Wildlife ID with active BC resident and hunting credentials is required to submit an application for LEH.

For the purpose of entering the LEH draw, persons residing in B.C. registered under the [Indian Act](#) (Canada) will be granted a Fish and Wildlife ID upon proving status and residency. Proof of status includes a Secure Certificate of Indian Status issued by the Government of Canada, or a letter from the Band Office or First Nation Government confirming status. The LEH application fee must be paid in order to enter the LEH draw.

The B.C. Government is responsible for balancing hunting opportunities for all residents of British Columbia, while managing for conservation and ensuring adequate priority is accorded to First Nations' harvest for food, social and ceremonial purposes within their traditionally used and treaty areas. First Nations may take responsibility for managing their members' harvest. The Province encourages mutual courtesy and respect between Indigenous and non-Indigenous hunters.

### Aboriginal Title in B.C.

On June 26, 2014, the Supreme Court of Canada granted the Tsilhqot'in Nation a declaration of Aboriginal title to a defined area of land located in the South Chilcotin, Cariboo Region of British Columbia. As a result of the Supreme Court of Canada decision, the status of these lands has changed and as title holder, the Tsilhqot'in Nation can determine use of and control access to the declared title lands. The Nation has announced that the title area is not publicly available for hunting at this time.

### Métis Hunters

All Métis individuals intending to hunt in British Columbia are required, under the [Wildlife Act](#), to hold a valid hunting licence and comply with all hunting regulations. This includes obtaining applicable species licences and complying with [Limited Entry Hunting Regulation](#).

## NOTICE TO MOUNTAIN GOAT HUNTERS

Starting in 2010, B.C. implemented regulations in an effort to minimize female (nanny) mountain goat harvest as an important conservation action. Outreach has consistently encouraged hunters to select a male (billy) mountain goat, when making a decision to harvest. The B.C. regulation states:

"It is unlawful to hunt a female mountain goat accompanying a kid or a female mountain goat in a group that contains one or more kids."


This regulation does not protect all female mountain goats as a solitary female mountain goat, or a female mountain goat within a group of goats that does not contain kids, would still be legal to harvest. That said, recent analysis of harvest demographic data since 2012 suggests that the proportion of females in the harvest has

generally decreased; still in some localized areas, there continues to be concerns over the high proportions of female mountain goats in the harvest. ## RESPIRATORY DISEASE IN WILD SHEEP AND MOUNTAIN GOATS

Disease introduction has contributed to declines in bighorn sheep populations across their range. Wild sheep and mountain goats are susceptible to a variety of infectious organisms carried by domestic sheep and goats, in particular those that cause respiratory diseases or pneumonia. The bacteria that may cause a syndrome of severe, life-threatening pneumonia include specific strains of *Pasteurella multocida*, *Mannheimia haemolytica* and *Mycoplasma ovipneumoniae* bacteria are often carried by domestic sheep and goats where they may or may not cause disease, due to adaptations from thousands of years of domestication. When wild sheep and goats are exposed to such organisms, they do not develop effective immune responses and pneumonia outbreaks can result in die-offs, affecting 5-95% of the herd. The disease may persist in survivors, resulting in kid mortalities and years of low lamb survival, followed by population declines. Research efforts have confirmed to North American wild sheep and mountain goat managers that physical separation of wild and domestic sheep and goats is the only management tool currently available to reduce the risk of disease transmission.

To assist in maintaining this separation, producers of domestic sheep and goats on private land in areas shared by wild sheep or in close proximity to mountain goats are encouraged to better understand this issue and to work with wildlife managers, see:

## WILD AND DOMESTIC SHEEP CONTACT

Across North America wild sheep herds have suffered catastrophic all-age die-offs, compounded by high lamb mortality and slow population recovery periods, from respiratory disease (pneumonia) transmitted from domestic sheep and goats. Despite several attempts, no vaccination treatments or preventative measures, other than physical separation, have been found to be highly successful at preventing exposure to *Mycoplasma ovipneumoniae* (*M. ovi*); the bacteria most responsible for respiratory disease outbreaks in wild sheep. Building off other efforts tested across the wild sheep scientific community that employ a suite of test-and-remove techniques (where wild sheep are captured, health sampled and those that are infected with *M.ovi*, are removed), B.C. along with support from NGOs and First Nations communities, has initiated test-and-remove projects in bighorn sheep herds that have continued to struggle with this disease. Results from lamb surveys in the first couple of years following these removal treatments has shown significant improvement in lamb survival.

B.C. continues to use many approaches to improve protecting wild sheep and restoring wild sheep populations. With funding from the Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation, Ministry of Agriculture and Food, Wild Sheep Foundation, the Wild Sheep Society of BC and support from the Province, the BC Sheep Separation Program is working to test domestic sheep and goats for *M.ovi* in high risk of contact areas near wild sheep range, and to promote education and outreach to domestic sheep and goat farmers to reduce the risk of contact and disease transmission between domestic and wild sheep and goats. ## B.C. MOUNTAIN GOAT AND WILD SHEEP NATAL APP

The BC Wildlife Program is asking for your observations of Mountain Goat, Thinhorn Sheep, and Bighorn Sheep from around B.C. in support of Citizen Science. The Provincial Wild Sheep and Mountain Goat Natal App allows hunter-conservationists and members of the public to easily submit what they see. The data collected will be used to inform BC's Regional Biologists when making important decisions around wild sheep and goat conservation, as well as provide information on the effects of changing climates, disease outbreaks/die-offs and other environmental and human pressures on our wild sheep and goat populations. Regular updates developed from submitted information are prepared and generally available through both the Wild Sheep Society of BC's Facebook page and the Rocky Mountain Goat Alliance's social media outreach.

Since launching this effort early in 2020, the data we are receiving has expanded well beyond the original scope and what was anticipated could be learned from citizen observations and contributions associated with our wild sheep and mountain goats. Of course, learning about new natal ranges and the timing of lambing and kidding events happened but also, learning about wildlife health and neonate (lamb and kid) survival in some areas where repeated observation data has been uploaded. Never has this proved more important than this past year when some field projects had to be delayed, curtailed and/or cancelled due to COVID 19 implications and catastrophic wildfires in southern BC.

## WILD SHEEP GENETICS

Wild sheep species distributions as well as their habitats in North America, have been shaped by repeated, historical glaciation events that created significant barriers to gene flow, resulting in our present-day distributions of Thinhorn and Bighorn sheep.

There are two subspecies of Thinhorn sheep, that have traditionally been classified based on pelage colour: the white coated and more northerly distributed Dall's sheep, and the dark coated and more southerly distributed Stone's sheep. While this system of classification works across the majority of thinhorn sheep range, sheep with a wide range of dark and intermediate colouration occur in south-central Yukon and north-western British Columbia. These sheep are commonly referred to as Fannin sheep and some consider them to be Stone's sheep, because of their non-white pelage.

Over the past two decades, researchers have used genetic analyses to improve our knowledge of Thinhorn sheep genetic relationships, also informing our understanding of Dall's, Stone's and Fannin sheep range distributions. This research has shown that previous geographic and colour-based subspecies classifications are not accurate. Recent work led from BC and in partnership with other jurisdictions and the University of Alberta was able to show that nearly the entire global population of Stone's sheep resides in BC, and that Fannin sheep (once thought to be Stone's sheep), found in south-central Yukon and north-western BC, are genetically more closely related to Dall's sheep than Stone's.
